Makin' a list and checking it twice...

The holidays are fun-filled but nearly 3,000 people are injured each year from accidental fires. As you prepare for the Christmas holiday, here are some safety tips to insure your family has a safe season.

- Before decorating, read all directions concerning installation and maintenance.
- Use lights certified by UL (Underwriters Laboratory.)
- Only use lights certified for OUTDOOR use outside.
- Discard any frayed, loose or brittle cords.
- Do not nail or staple light strings or damage insulation when supporting the lights.
- Unplug electrical decorations before replacing bulbs or fuses.
- The rule is: No more than 3 strings of lights connected together! Light strings with screw-in lights should have no more than 50 bulbs.
- Do not overload extension cords.



Check specific directions for each set of lights you use.

- Keep extension cords and light strings clear of snow and standing water.
- Use caution decorating near power lines, especially when using a ladder.
- Turn off decorations before leaving home or going to bed.
- Protect outdoor lights and decoration circuits with GFCIs.
- Do not allow children or pets to play with electrical decorations.

Knowing that you have the right equipment and have decorated your home safely brings extra peace during the season.

Trustee tenure terms explained

The following article contains the Trustees
Tenure with pertinent information regarding eligibility and requirements for potential Trustee candidates.

No person shall be eligible to become or remain a Trustee in the Cooperative who:

- 1. Is not a Member of the Cooperative and a bona fide resident, domiciled and receiving service at their residence within the particular District where they are to represent; or
- 2. Is in any way employed by by or financially interested in a competing enterprise or a business selling electric energy or

- supplies to the Cooperative, or a business primarily engaged in selling electrical or plumbing appliances, fixtures or supplies to the Members of the Cooperative; or
- 3. Is the incumbent of or candidate for an elective public office in connection with which a salary or Compensation in excess of one thousand dollars per annum is paid; or
- Has served seven (7)
 consecutive terms as a
 Trustee without a one term layout (a term shall
 be designated as three
 consecutive years); or
- Has a spouse who has served as a Trustee for the immediate preceding term; or

- 6. Is related to any employee or incumbent trustee of the Cooperative within the third degree of blood or marriage: or
- 7. Has not attained the age of eighteen (18); or
- Has been convicted or pleaded guilty to a felony.

Trustee Terms: A
Trustee Term (Trustee
Term) is three (3) years and
the Trustee shall serve until
a successor is elected and
qualified. The Cooperative
shall stagger Trustee Terms
by dividing the total number
of authorized Trustees into
groups of approximately
equal number. Members,
therefore will annually elect
an approximately equal
number of Trustees.

Dish out the cleaning assignments!

Big holiday dinners, overnight company and loads of baked goodies create extra dishes to wash from Christmas until New Year's.

So it's a good idea to save energy on dishwashing. Luckily, that's easy to do if your dishwasher has energy-saving features.

Here are some tips for energy-efficiency dishwashing:

Read your dishwasher's instruction manual. Too many people ignore the energy-saving features that came with their dishwashers.

Use your dishwasher's energy-saving or short-wash cycle for every load unless the

dishes contain caked-on, hardto-remove food.

Choose the dishwasher's airdry setting instead of the heat-dry setting. Dishes dry a bit slower, but still get thoroughly dry.

There's no need to pre-rinse dishes. Save the hot water; your dishwasher is designed to do the scrubbing for you!

Choosing the best electric knife avoids a butchered turkey

Slicing through a turkey without tearing it to shreds or fighting to remove wings and legs isn't the easiest Christmas-turkey chore.

Perhaps adding an electric knife to your holiday list would simplify the carving.

Don't base your selection simply on price or appearance. An electric knife is a small appliance and should be treated as such.

1. You get what you pay for. The top of the line costs about \$50. It will probably last longer, stay sharper and come with added safety features.



Choose a corded or a cordless. electric knife. Cordless varieties are nice because you can carve the turkey anywhere, but you must have the battery charged.

- 3. If you plan to slice meat only, you only need one blade. slicing bread and vegetables, you'll need a second, shorter blade.
- 4. Meat slicing requires enough "torque" to make the job easy.
- 5. Try the knife "on" at the store to see if it feels comfortable in your hand. Remove the blade and see if that is an easy chore. Test the appliance for noise. Is it earshattering? Consider a model with a safety lock to prevent little ones from opening the box and finding the sharp blades.

You might even select another electric knife as a gift...
